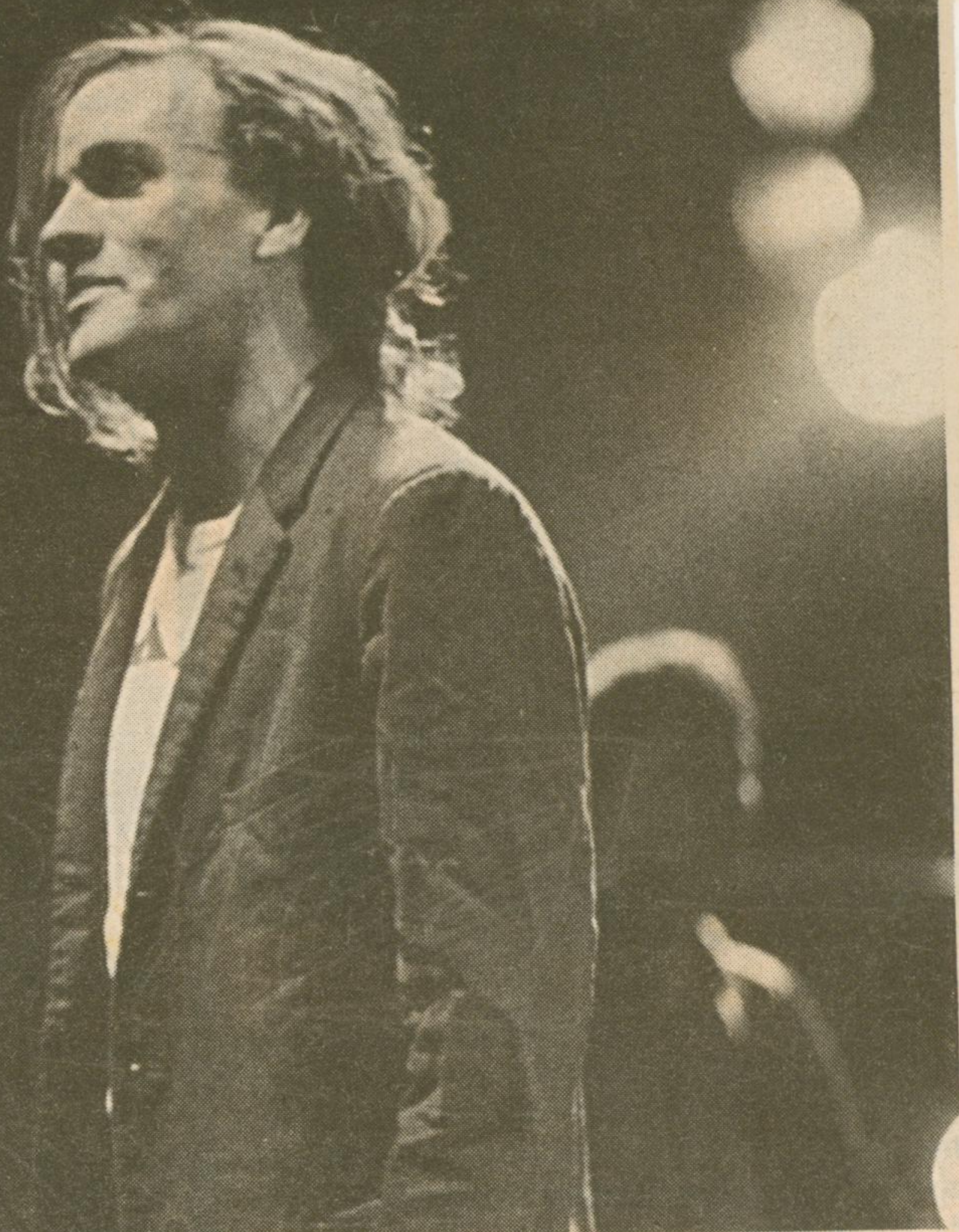


R.E.M. are to play an 11 date tour of the UK in May, the first time they have appeared here since a one-off date at the Hammersmith Odeon in September 1987. The UK shows are part of a world tour which begins in the Far East at the beginning of February and sees them playing their biggest venues to date, including a debut appearance at New York's Madison Square Gardens.

R.E.M.'s new record company, Warners, has confirmed that former Dbs guitarist Peter Holsapple will be appearing with the band. Holsapple has been friends with REM since their early days and was recruited to flesh out the live sound on the American leg of the tour which began in St. Louis last week.

The UK dates begin in Leicester at the De Montfort Hall on May 17 and continue at Newport Centre (18), Portsmouth Guildhall (19), Liverpool Royal Court (21), Nottingham Royal Concert Hall (22), Edinburgh Playhouse (23), Glasgow Barrowlands (24), Newcastle City Hall (26), Manchester Apollo (27) and London Hammersmith Odeon (29 and 30).

Tickets are on sale now from the box offices and usual agents priced £7 and £6 for Leicester, Liverpool, Nottingham, Newcastle and Manchester, £7 for Newport and Portsmouth, £8 and £7 for Edinburgh and London, and £7.50 for Glasgow.

Over hip, over-hyped and over here for their West Midlands debut at long last - The Strokes finally made it, some eight months later than planned.

Last June the New York quintet was due to play the upstairs bar at the Academy but had to cancel because drummer Fabrizio Moretti broke his hand.

One worldwide hit album later and they have finally fulfilled the booking - only this time in the main room.

The place was heaving and the band could probably have done another night with ease.

Agency

The Strokes have looks, hooks and plenty of Noo Yawk attitude. They are unashamedly retro in their approach and elements of Television, Blondie and the Velvet Underground can be heard in their sound.

Some people have been suspicious of the band's privileged and well-connected background: singer Julian Casablancas's dad runs a big model agency and guitarist Albert Hammond Jr's is a well-known songwriter from the 70s.

Every band ultimately rises and falls by the quality of its material - and not every act has a searing New York City Cops or the magnificent power pop Motown of Last Nite to draw on.

The Strokes' first Birmingham show may have been some time coming but it was well worth the wait.



MORRISSEY
Birmingham Academy

MORRISSEY came on stage to the dramatic sound of church bells ringing, but his performance didn't really strike a chord. Smiths fans were out in force to see their idol back on stage in Birmingham and all looked good as he kicked off with I Want the One I Can't Have. But all too soon, Morrissey veered off onto his solo tracks - like Suedehead, Hairdresser and Sister I'm a Poet - with the obligatory kicks at record labels, the Government and anyone else he could think to moan about thrown in. It might have been perfect for the Indie era, but now he just looks a little past his prime. Morrissey is still a fantastic performer, his voice and stage presence are unique. But it says a lot that he opened and closed with songs by The Smiths, even though he remains staunchly bitter about their split. Morrissey seems to know that although it's now a long time ago and he has a strong following in his own right, he will always be loved best for being the cynical icon of 80s pop.

If we're talking Great Britons, how about a late entry for one Steven Morrissey, a musical messiah from Manchester in a business full of false prophets. It is been 17 years since I was caught up in the Morrissey-Marr magic of a concert by The Smiths, who were the best band ever in my book. So I really had no idea what to expect from a fortysomething Morrissey who has spent the last few years hiding away in LA without a record contract. But as soon as the singer opened up with a blistering version of The Smiths classic I Want The One I Can't Have, the success of last night's gig was never in doubt. After two sell-out concerts at the Royal Albert Hall last month, a heaving Birmingham Academy was the first of a handful of new dates in the UK. He's a little fuller in the face, his voice may be a little deeper, but the charismatic Moz knows how to captivate an audience and made a triumphant return with a simple show and a no-frills four-piece band. Don't ever tell me he's a misery guts. Morrissey was positively cheerful last night, with the sort of quips between songs that you'd expect from someone who lists Oscar Wilde among his heroes. New songs like The First of the Gang To Die, a tilt at the UK's growing gun culture, sounded spot on and prompted football-style chants of "Sign him up, sign him up," from his adoring fans in a male dominated audience.

Swaggering rock superstars Oasis kicked off the first of two sell-out shows in Birmingham last night with a blinding set which had the crowd bouncing from start to finish.

With such an enviable repertoire, there were always going to be a few favourites missing, notably Some Might Say and Champagne Supernova.

But maybe the biggest surprise of the night, apart from rebel Liam managing to refrain from throwing tantrums and swearing (disappointing for those hoping to see a bit of that famous Gallagher temper) was the encore, a rocking version of The Who's My Generation.

The brothers belted out the track as the audience went wild before Liam, who twice caused near-riots by lobbing two tambourines into the crowd, jumped down from the stage and greeted a few lucky fans before disappearing backstage for good.

Like the Smiths, Springsteen or, dare one say it, U2, R.E.M. is an act whose musical manifesto inspires the kind of detailed scrutiny and passionate belief in its authors that is out of all proportion to its status as a band of popular music entertainers. R.E.M.'s home, the tiny university town of Athens, Georgia (population 42,549), has become one of rock's instant geographical reference points. From its beginnings in 1980 as a gang of thoughtful bohemian drop-outs, scuffling round the US college circuit, the group has made gradual, yet ineluctable progress to become the sage-like stars of the current world tour, now into its fifth month. All the shows on the UK leg, which starts this week and ends at Wembley Arena on June 22, have sold out, many of them in

a matter of hours. R.E.M.'s sixth album, *Green*, is its most cohesive and assured collection to date, and is, of course, a million seller. Undoubtedly gifted, strangely imperturbable, and never knowingly undersold by the critics, R.E.M. is set fair to become the rock'n'roll band of the Nineties. Show that should REM-ind the DJs

It's staggering that a band which has received hardly any airplay on radio throughout Britain can pack Birmingham's vast NEC Arena. Yet that is exactly what REM did last night and went on to show why they have been tagged America's hottest musical export. The band, heavily influenced by a string of supergroups including the Rolling Stones and The Doors, has won high acclaim from the music press worldwide. But the four-piece from Georgia has yet to be fully recognised here in Britain by radio DJs. Blistering performances of the latest single, Orange Crush, and old favourites Stand and Finest Work Song were dished out to a grateful audience of the converted followers last night. REM is coming to the end of a gruelling six-month world tour — during which it has carried the Greenpeace banner high. Many have no doubt been won over by the group's music — and its ecology call.
