Del Shannon who was born in Grand Rapids, Michigan on 30th December, 1939, has enjoyed spectacular success in the short time that has elapsed since his first hit-record "Runaway" topped both American and British charts in the Summer of 1961. Seven of his singles have achieved Top Twenty status in both countries, "Runaway" being followed by "Hats Off To Larry", "So Long, Baby", "Hey Little Girl", "Cry Myself To Sleep", "Swiss Maid" (the only hit he didn't pen himself) and his current record "Little Town Flirt" which has proved a tremendous success.

Del started playing the guitar and singing at the age of fourteen. After graduating from High School he entered the army as a radio operator. Whilst stationed in Germany he took part in an army concert which started the handsome Del off on the road to musical stardom, he was such a success that on his discharge he was rushed to a recording studio in New York where he made his disc debut.

Since then he has made show-stopping tours of Australia, New Zealand and the Far East. Last Autumn he toured Britain with Dion and Joe Brown and received a tumultuous reception everywhere.

On the personal side Del likes to hop into his Ford Thunderbird and go fishing on the Great Lakes and fresh water streams of Michigan.

Del who more than anything else owes his popularity to his unique yodelling 'gimmick' is sure to remain one of the most consistent poll topping stars for years, for there can be doubt about his star quality and dynamic personality which has the fans spellbound during his act.

Johnny Tillotson

Johnny Tillotson, 23, is the good-looking young university graduate from Jacksonville, Florida, whose "Poetry in Motion" disc-hit swept him to world-wide fame just two years ago—it sold half a million copies in Britain alone.

The eldest of three children, Johnny was born on 20th April 1939. He 5 feet 8 inches tall, has reddish-brown hair and deep brown eyes and weighs around 135 pounds.

Johnny got his big break when a music publisher heard him sing in a talent contest in Nashville and arranged a recording audition. But the spark which really fired the imagination of Johnny Tillotson and sent him helter-skelter on a rock'n'rollin' career was ignited one evening in Jacksonville, when a Country-and-Western package show blew into town for a two-night stand. That night an unknown and unpublicized singer named Elvis Presley introduced Johnny and a spellbound audience to rock'n'roll music in an electrifying performance they were never to forget. Apart from his "Poetry in Motion" hit, Johnny's greatest successes to date are "Send me the pillow you dream on" and "It keeps right on a-hurtin'", a ballad which he wrote himself.

Ask Johnny his favourite likes and he'll tell you "Hamburgers, bar-b-cue chicken, ham'n'eggs, drive-in movies, beach parties, dancing, and dates with girls who are down to earth, with something meaningful to talk about."

Kenny Lynch



Kenny Lynch is a 23 year old cockney sparrow who has given up street trading, semi-pro singing, amateur boxing, tailoring, film extra work, and barman/compere in Sammy McCarthy's pub to become a professional singer and entertainer.

His recording "Up on the Roof" proved his greatest success to date this was backed by yet another of his own compositions "Jump on your Broomstick". His latest disc is of course "Misery".

Kenny has become a prolific songwriter. The new Columbia film "Just for Fun" contains four of his songs—two which he performs himself and one each by the lead stars.

Kenny is the youngest of thirteen brothers and sisters. Only his sister Maxine Daniels of all his family sang professionally and she had to give up a promising career through ill-health.

Kenny's biggest thrill so far was on the seventh of November, 1962, when he was presented to and sang for H.R.H. Princess Margaret at the opening of a new youth club in Bolton.

His ambitions include owning an 'E' type Jaguar making an album of Christmas carols and becoming an inside member of the 100.

Kenny Lynch (that is his real name) was born in Stepney, East London twenty-three years ago on the twentieth of March, 1939. He is 5' 7½" and weighs 9st 7lb, with black hair and brown eyes. He did his national service in the RASC where his boxing ability was discovered.

The Springfields



Last year the Springfields—brother and sister Tom and Dusty Springfield and their friend Mike Pickworth—became the first ever British vocal group to record in Nashville, Tennessee, the acknowledged home of country-and-western music the world over.

The Springfields have achieved a group sound that is totally different from that created by any other vocal team in Britain. It has a folksy quality, a country-and-western flavour and overtones of the Latin-American style. They sing in nine languages, including Russian, Hebrew, Greek and Czechoslovak, and play guitars banjos and a wide variety of Latin percussion instruments.

The Spring of 1961 marked the trio's disc debut on Philips with "Dear John". This was followed up with "Breakaway" and, around Christmas 1961, their big hit, "Bambino", an arrangement of an old Neapolitan carol. Of course their greatest success to date has been their fabulous recording of "Island of Dreams". Their latest disc is "Say I Won't Be There" which is rapidly climbing the charts.

Dusty Springfield is a 23-year-old green-eyed blonde; her brother Tom is 26 and has brown hair and eyes. The newest member of the trio is Mike Pickworth, who joined in November last year. Mike is 21, has dark brown hair and grey eyes and is 6' 1½" tall.

Island of Dreams - Say I Won't Be There



Rey Anton

Rey Anton is a good looking 23 year old from Battersea, London with a good background in the entertainment field.

After an apprenticeship in cabaret, clubs and one-night-stands, Rey's first professional engagement was at Churchill's club in Bond Street. Since then he has appeared on bills with such top performers as Max Munro and Jimmy Wheeler. He appeared on television with Michael Medwin and was also featured on the sound track of the controversial film "Saturday Night and Sunday Morning" with Johnny Dankworth.

"Peppermint Man", a slow twisting American song is the title of Rey's first record.



Peppi

Peppi was born in Sarasota, Florida on 22nd October, 1938 of Theatrical parents. His Show Business training commenced when he was just five years old and after three years he was working professionally with his sister Nita. Their original dance act soon became in great demand and they were asked to appear with many of the top names in American Show Business. Tours with Jack Benny, Dean Martin, Jerry Lewis, Judy Garland, Sammy Davis Jr. etc. followed fast and furious.

At this time a new dance was sweeping the States and a young man named Chubby Checker was becoming a National figure. The "Twist" had hit town . . . On seeing how popular this new dance could soon be,

Peppi started to work out "twist routines" and very shortly became the idol of thousands of Hollywood teenagers. Peppi since those days at the end of 1961 has travelled extensively on one-night stands, variety bills etc., covering the whole of the British Isles and appearing with the top names in the 'pop' world of Show Business including Dion, Del Shannon, Freddie Cannon, Max Bygraves, Joe Brown, Eden Kane, The Springfields, Johnny Tillotson and many others. Peppi's style of twisting and vocalising has been seen by millions through the medium of television, broadcasting etc.

The Eagles



The Eagles were formed five years ago at the Eagle House Club in Bristol. The group is made up of Terry Clark on lead guitar, Johnny Payne on rhythm guitar, Michael Brice on bass, Rod Meacham on drums.

Their first record was an E.P. "Some People" which was very popular and even entered the singles charts this was followed by "The March of the Eagles" backed with Exodus.

Jerry Stevens

Between engineering studies, Jerry began singing with a local dance band in his home town, Sheffield, some six years ago. Then came his national service, after which Jerry gained more experience doing an act at local dinners, dances and cinemas. After a few months he auditioned at Huddersfield's Palace Continental, and the manager booked him for two weeks in quick succession. From this he did Variety and Cabaret work all over the North. Jerry then turned professional and did a successive tour of Germany. This was followed by a Christmas show at Blackpool and then opened in January, 1962 at his first night club date in the West End.

After completing a show with Mike and Bernie Winters and the Springfields on the South Coast, he joined a production at the Parade Theatre Skegness, with Jimmy James and Bill Maynard and delighted holiday-makers with his impressive voice and talented impersonations. Jerry made his television debut in August last year on ABC-TV's "Big Night Out" series.
